Hon'ble Prime Minister of India did digital launch of New Model Degree College Lylhkothi, on February 3, 2019, which was another step towards materialization of the dream of the people of the area. It is an exclusive Model College among all the model colleges of Himachal Pradesh. The college is surrounded by beautiful hills and offers a panoramic view. Though still in its nascent stage, the college has opened new vistas for the public, especially girls hailing from rural areas in the vicinity, realizing their dream of higher education. The opening of this college has given a boost to women empowerment through the successful education campaign "*Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao.*" We can claim with a sense of satisfaction and pride that about 66% of the registered students in the college are girls.

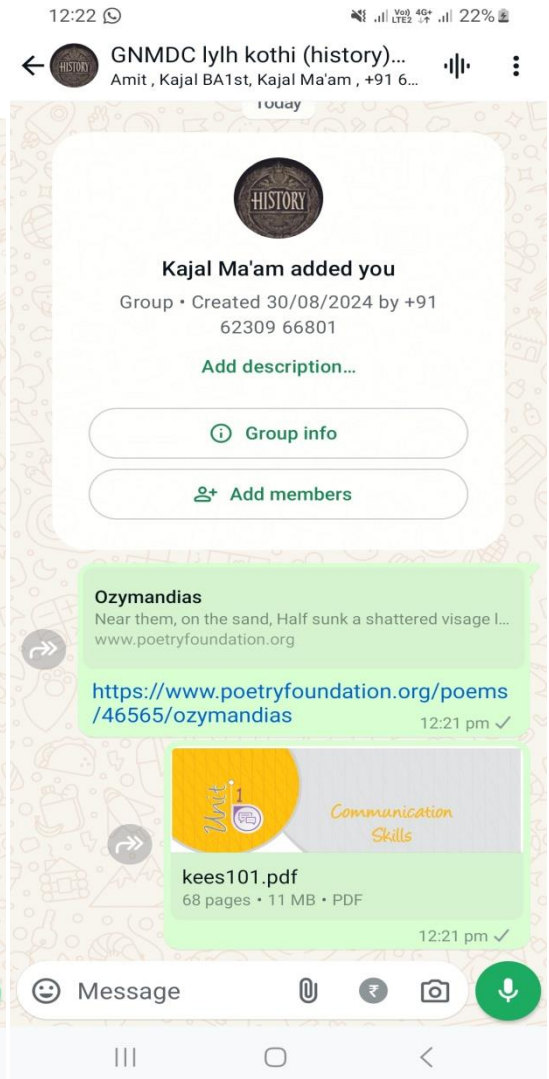
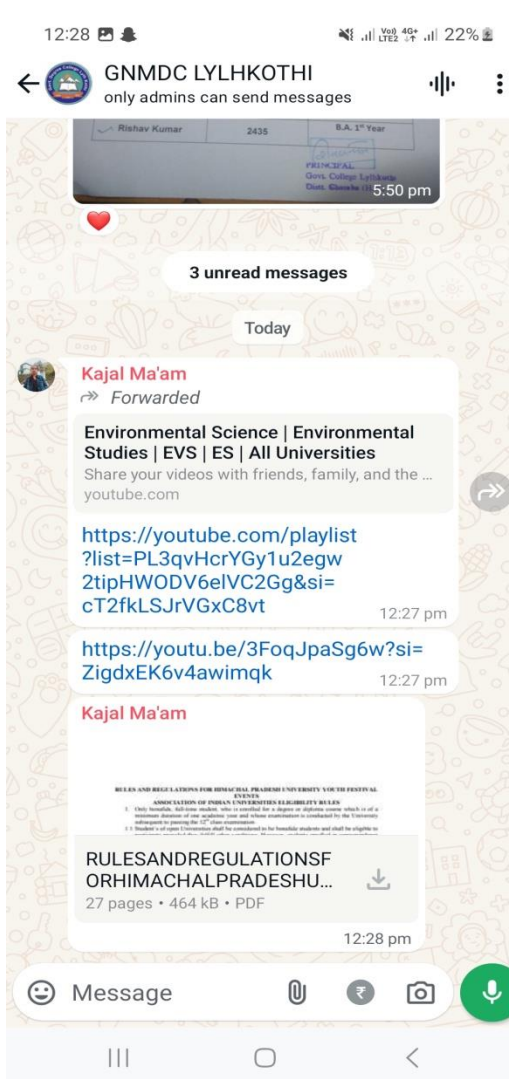



1.3. Add- on Course/Certificate Courses:

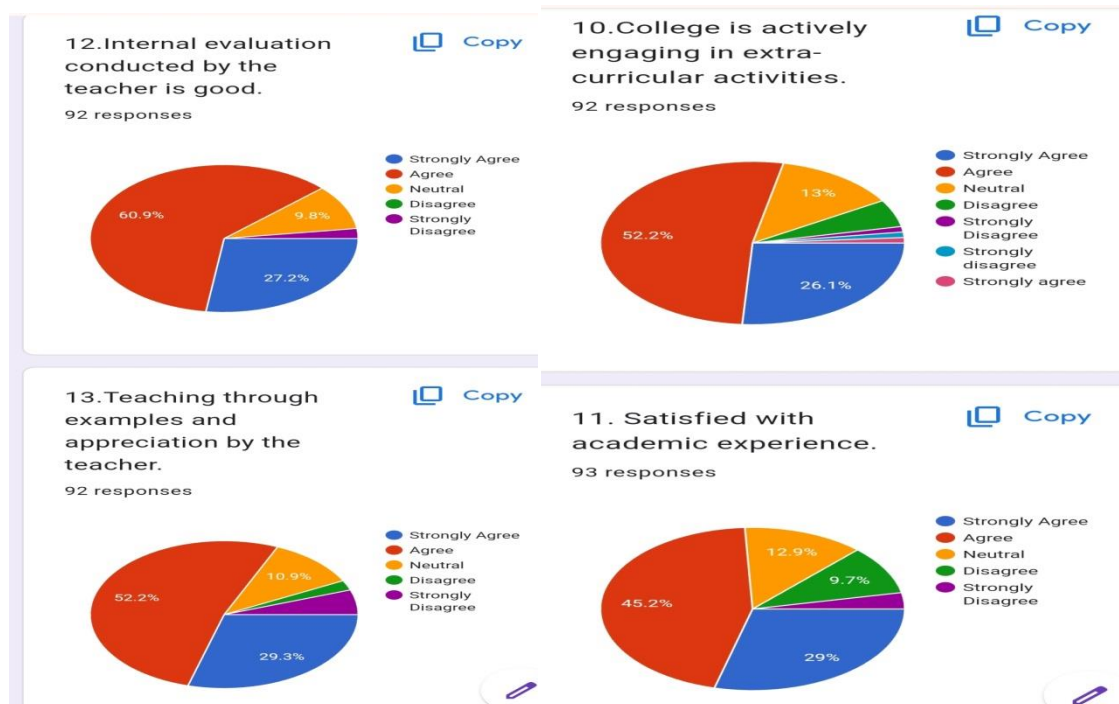



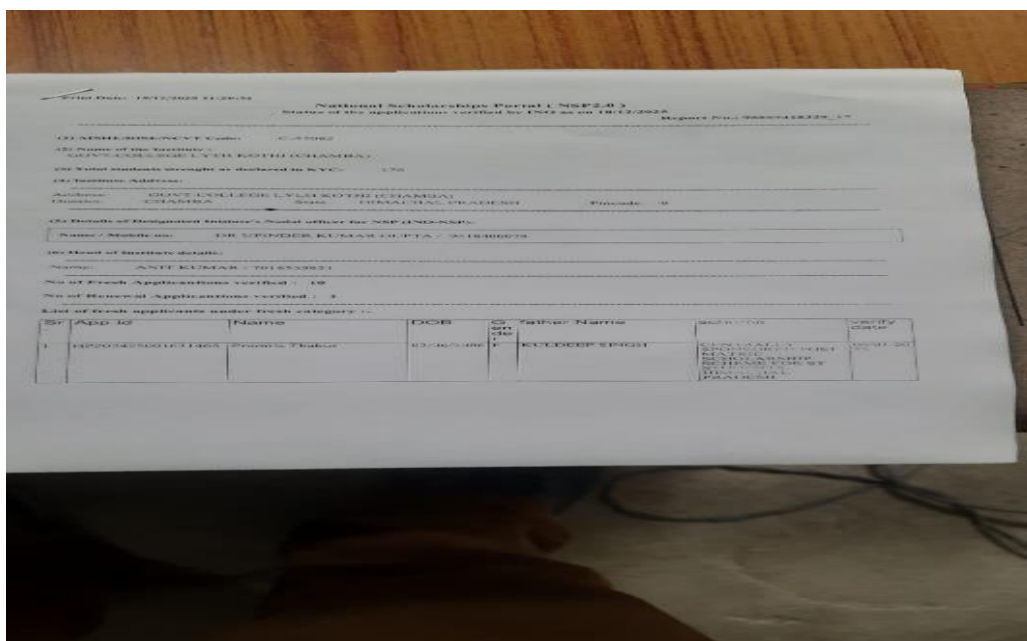
coordinate the activities of different subjects. CCA (continuous comprehensive assessment) is given on the basis of class test, tutorial, attendance, assignments etc.


Painting Competition & Sign Board Writing

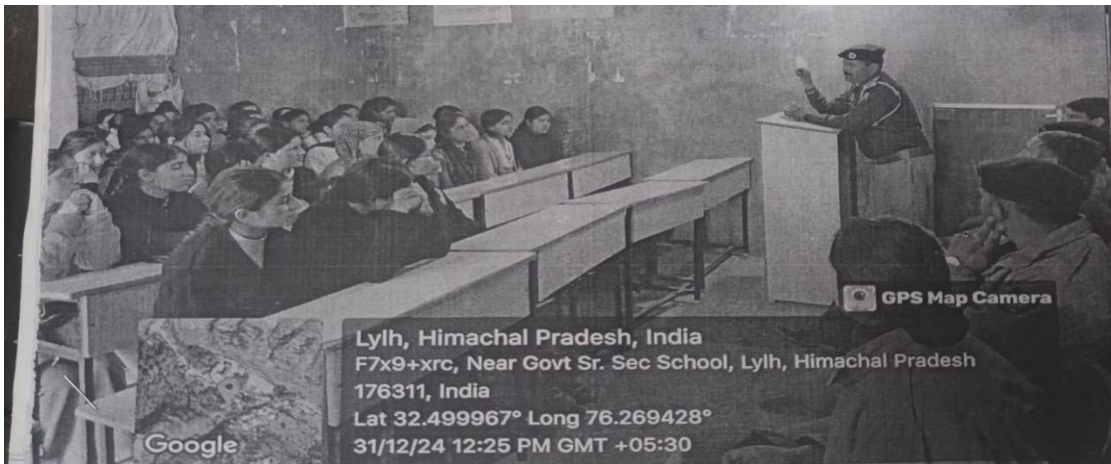

Run for Awareness :- Red Ribbon Club Marathon - 16/08/2024.

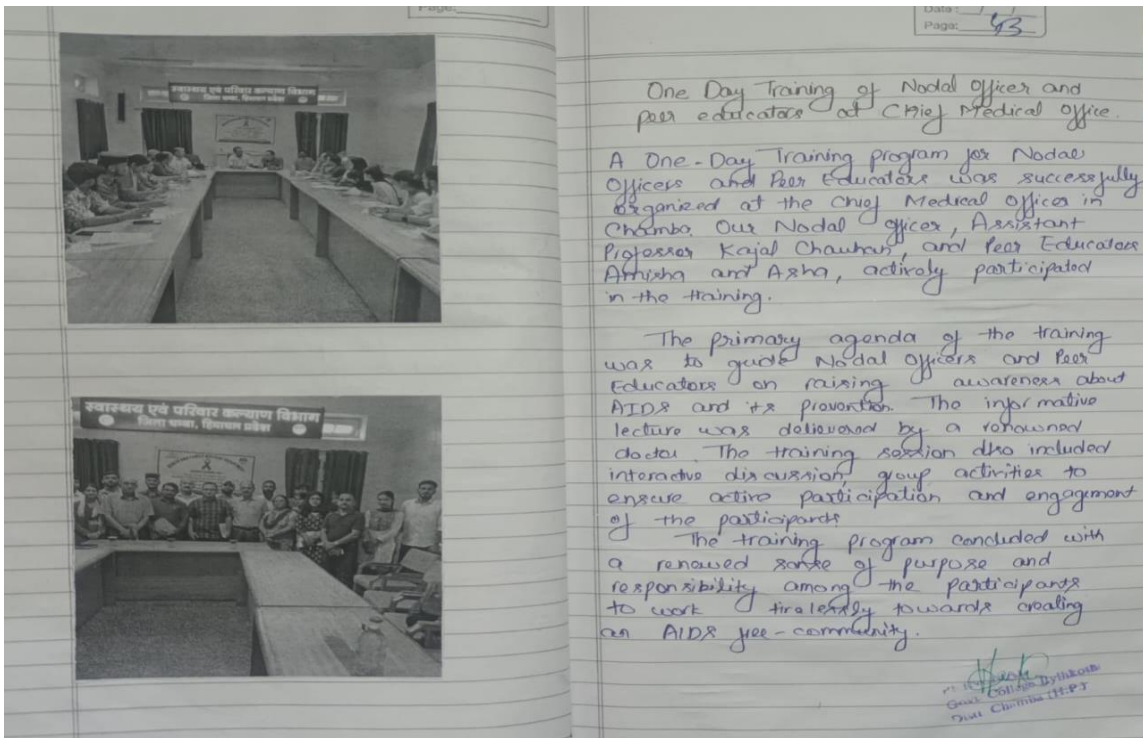

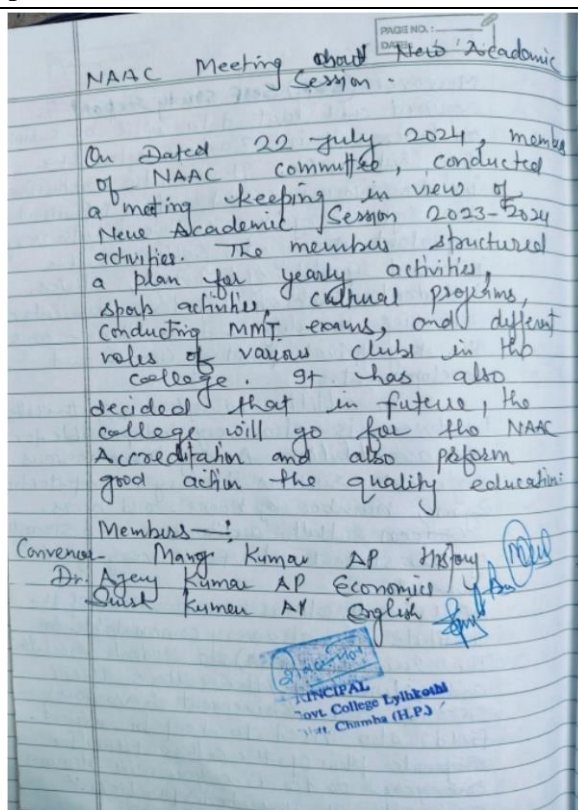
2. IQAC:

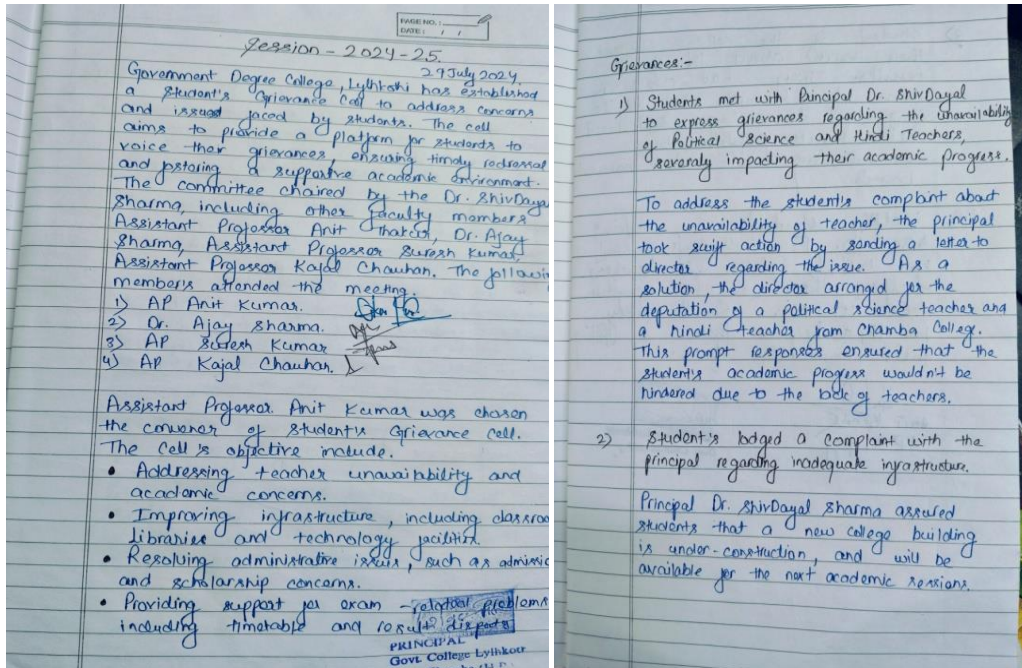

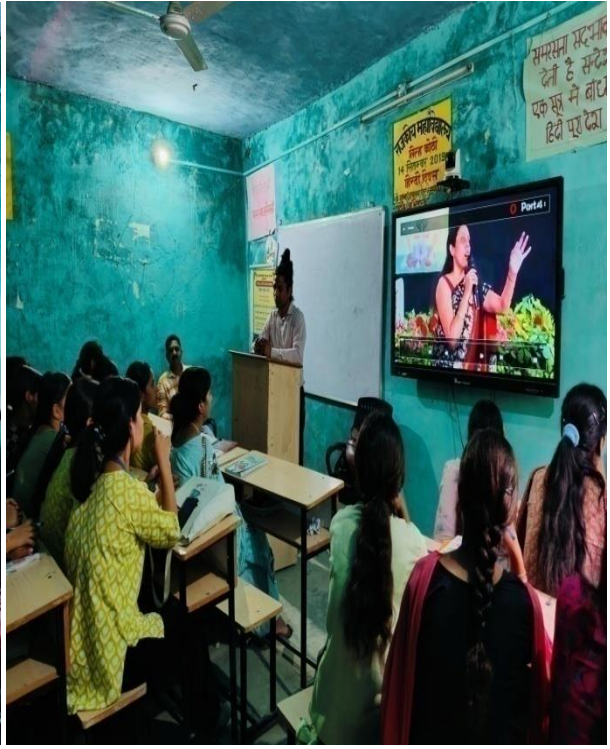

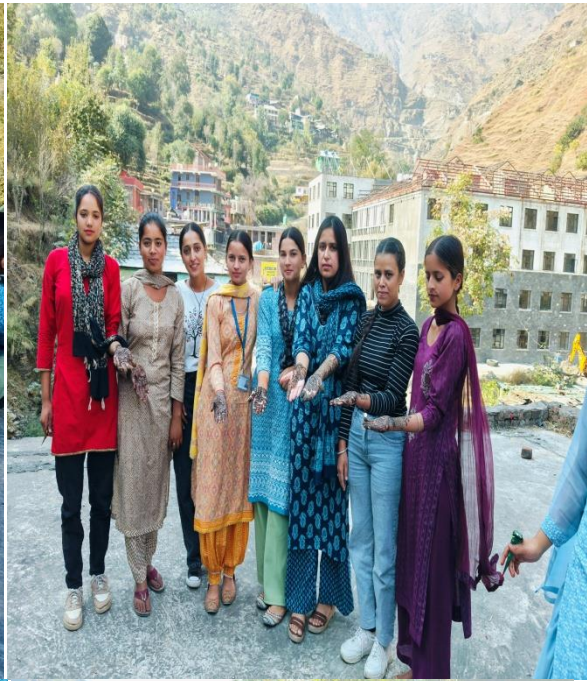
